Ace Program

ACE (Adolescents Coping with Emotions) is a Cognitive Behavioural Therapy Program that has been offered at Osoyoos Secondary for the past ten years. The program helps youth understand and explore healthy coping skills in order to better deal with their lives and the challenges they face. The focus is on thinking patterns, shifting thought patterns or self-talk, communication skills, social skills, assertiveness, negotiation skills, problem solving skills and self-esteem. Storm the Wall is Coming

On Wednesday, June 11 Osoyoos Secondary will hold its second annual Storm the Wall event. Storm the Wall is a five-person relay event. One participant from each team will complete one cycle of: Swimming (100 meters), Sprinting (300 metres), Cycling (3 km) and Running (1 km), while one team member will remain at the Wall until their teammates have arrived. From here, all team members must scale the wall successfully to complete the event.

What is the wall?

The wall is a 10 foot high 24 feet wide vertical challenge.

Wall Regulations

Men's Teams - A person must first be assisted over the front side of the wall before being allowed to assist from the top of the wall. Once over the wall, team members can climb down the back side of the wall (rung by rung) and return to the front of the wall to assist other members over.

Women's and CoRec Teams - A maximum of two persons are allowed to climb up the back side of the wall (without having gone over themselves first) to assist teammates from the top of the wall.

Where will this take place?

START: SAFARI BEACH

STAGE 1: Swim (100 m – around marker and back).

Once the swimmer has completed their swim, they will exit the lake and tag their sprinter at the doors to the outdoor pool deck area.

STAGE 2: Sprint (300 m)

Sprinter will exit onto the beach and run down 89th Street. They will run to the intersection of 89th and Oleander where they will turn left to the small staging areas for bicycles.

STAGE 3: Cycle (3 Km)

The cyclist will take off as their sprinter crosses the Sprint Finish Line and tags them. They will cycle down Oleander to Lobelia and then right onto 26th. After crossing Highway 97, the cyclists will turn left onto 107th followed by a right onto 20th (Golf Course Drive). Cyclists will stop and tag runners at the dirt parking area near Desert Park.

STAGE 4: Run (1 Km)

The runner will start at the dirt area south of desert park. The runner will run behind desert park along the dirt trail down to 115th street up to the school fields.

STAGE 5: The Wall

The team runs up to the wall and the runner touches it first. The entire team must then scale the wall, in whatever order they want as long as they follow the wall regulations. Once the entire team has gone over the wall they must cross the finish line, located directly behind each wall. Again, the runner (with the race number) MUST be the last to cross the finish line.

Students ran from one building to the next to solve the "Crime of the Century". This game of Clue gave students an opportunity to become familiar with the campus.
