We have had a busy but smooth start to the year. Currently, we have an enrollment of 231 students, 5 less than we projected. Last year, OSS students did very well (see Provincial exam results on page 3), and we are committed to continuing our students' strong academic achievement this year.

Our goals for this year are to continue to find approaches that increase students' motivation, engagement and achievement. Our focus areas for inquiry in support of this goal are as follows:

- Assessment for Learning.
- Using Grade 7 students achievement data to determine student placements and class organization.
- Response to Intervention (RTI) - using the set of strategies to better meet the needs of all learners in each class.
- Technology and Computer Applications for Learning.
- Climate and Culture—engaging students in school through student centered climate and culture activities.

Our staff will be using Inquiry time the last Wednesday of each month to work on their learning and application of strategies related to these focus areas.

Timetable Exploration

One of our additional focus areas this year is to explore other timetable/scheduling possibilities for the 2016-2017 school year. Our goal is to provide our students with a well-rounded education with courses that meet student needs/interests, lead to graduation, and support students' post-secondary plans. This becomes ever more challenging as enrollment declines.

Currently we run a hybrid linear-semester timetable for grade 8s and 9s, and a semester timetable for grade 10s to 12s. Last year, we visited A.L. Fortune Secondary in Enderby to look at their timetable. A.L. Fortune runs a modified "open" timetable that they developed several years ago in response to declining enrollment. We will be sending a team of students, teachers and parents to AL. Fortune again this year to learn about what they are doing, and if that might be a better fit for our students' learning. As well, we will be sending a team to Eagle River Secondary in Sicamous. They have also adopted a non-traditional timetable.

During our visits we will be talking with students, teachers, administrators and hopefully parents about the workings of their respective timetables, and bring that information back to OSS to share with our school community via newsletters, emails, assemblies and forums.

Nothing has been decided except that we will go through the process of gathering information, and sharing it with our school community. We hope to have information out to parents prior to Christmas break, spend January and February in discussion about whether or not a change (and what that change might look like) is to the benefit of our students. We would then make a final decision in March/April on keeping or modifying our timetable. Post-Secondary Schools Visit OSS

OSS was pleased to host the annual Post-Secondary Institution Visitation Day on the morning of Tuesday, September 29, 2015. Fourteen post-secondary schools and training facilities from BC sent representatives to speak to grade 11 and 12 OSS students interested in learning more about various post-secondary programs offered throughout the province. Students signed up for two sessions of their choice followed by a mini-fair in the concourse where they had the opportunity to ask questions regarding programs, requirements for admission, residence costs and student services. Any student wishing to further discuss post-secondary options can arrange to see Mr. Chapman. Grads are reminded to apply for admission to their post-secondary institution(s) of interest asap. Grade 12 Graduation

For a grade 12 student to participate in the year-end graduation ceremony, he/she must be on-line to successfully complete the required 80 credits as outlined in the 2004 Graduation Program. At our first grade 12 assembly in September, all grade 12's were advised to see Mr. Safek to ensure that they are eligible to graduate. Grad Transitions

All students expecting to graduate from a B.C. high school are expected to complete the four credit Grad Transitions program. All grade 12 students have received a hard copy of their Grad Transitions course, and learning requirements have been reviewed with them by Mr. Safek. Their Grad Transitions work is due on Monday, May 2, although if students work on this regularly, they ought to be able to complete it well before then. As well, Mr. Safek will be emailing students their Grad Transitions course. The course is set up so that the majority of the learning activities can be done and submitted electronically. As well, we will be sending all parents a copy of the Grad Transitions course. Parents, please take some time to review it with your child and monitor their progress from time to time to ensure they are working on it. Mr. Safek will also be meeting with grade 12's and holding regular "help" sessions to support students and ensure that they are on track to complete their Grad Transitions requirements satisfactorily. In order to vote, you must register. You can register and vote at:

1. An Elections Canada office (8322 Main Street, Osoyoos)
2. The polling place during advance voting, October 9-12 between noon and 8:00 pm (Sonora Centre in Osoyoos)
3. The polling place on regular voting day, October 19 between 7:00 am and 7:00 pm (the Inkameep Community Hall on Sandpoint Drive for those who live on OIB land, and Sonora Centre for Osoyoos residents)

You will need identification to register and vote. To see the list of authorized ID, go to the Elections Canada website at www.elections.ca and click on ID to Vote. And don't forget to remind your parents to vote!!
